WINDING UP FOR FALL!

Not only are we having our BIG event as you all know on November 13th, this is also the year the club is celebrating our 20th anniversary! 2. **Trail Maintenance:** By working with park rangers at O'Neill Regional Park to maintain two specific trails (Vista and the Arroyo trails) and the Harmon Equestrian Area.
3. **Charity Events:** By conducting charity events for organizations in Orange County that use horses to improve the lives of children and young adults.

A big thanks to Rick, our vice-president, for creating, organizing and distributing the donation-getting folders at the September 2nd meeting. As Rick explained, these are for each of you to use when you talk to your friends, neighbors, favorite merchants and business associates for donations to our Charity event. We need everyone's help. What the club is asking, and what we need to support these very wonderful and worthwhile charities is your help getting donations for our auction. The folder has all of the information you'll need, and explains what to say with an easy-to-follow, step-by-step plan for success. We also now have a tax-deductible 501(c)3 Foundation so all donations are truly tax deductible! This provides the incentive every business person needs to support our charity event. It really is easy and the charities we've chosen speak for themselves.

As we get closer to the official fire season we want to be sure everyone knows what to do and how to prepare. Please keep in mind that Trabuco Canyon Fire Watch has a weekly radio net for GMRS users. We meet on the Joplin repeater, channel 2, every Monday evening at 7:30 pm. The purpose of this net is to allow a core group of GMRS users to enhance their radio communication skills and allow all users to be comfortable transmitting over the radio.

Several ETI members are GMRS users and hold an FCC license which allows them to use the local Joplin repeater. If you wish to learn more contact Dave Seroski (Communications coordinator for ETI), Bob

Wilks, or Jeff or Debbie Kelly. Keep in mind that if Trabuco Canyon experiences an emergency; we will be utilizing the Joplin repeater (channel 2 on GMRS) and Channel 22 on your FRS hand held radios. This will be the most efficient way to obtain local information for Trabuco Canyon. Please read your FRS owners manual regarding licensing requirements.

Please be sure your family and pet emergency kits are up to date and accessible. For information on Emergency Preparedness you can go to the Red Cross website. For your pets, including large animals, you can go to the Orange County Animal Care website or for horses specifically, go to the ETI National hyperlink is Docs/Forms- "What do I do with my horse in fire, flood, or earthquake".

Q: What's the best way to contact a business?

A: Whenever possible, it's usually better to show up at a place of business and talk to the owner or manager IN PERSON ... It shows that we're committed to our cause and are willing to take the time to discuss this with them personally. ... (Usually better than trying to convince someone over the phone).

Q: What printed materials can I use to help me request an Auction Item Donation?

A: We have a '**Cover Letter / Letter of Intent**', that you can print out and give to any business. It explains everything they need to know about our Fund Raising Event. There is also a Poster, which is a great way to get people excited about the event. (It prints out best at 11 X 17).

And finally, there is a **501(c)3 Tax Deductible Receipt**. Businesses will want this.

(When you receive an auction item, make sure to give them a receipt, and make out a duplicate version for our club records).

These three documents have been emailed to you (the Letter and Poster are also on www.saddleback-canyonriders.com), but please email or call me if you would like me to re-email them.

How it will work: All proceeds will go to 'ETI Foundation' (a 501(c)3 Charity Organization) who will then equally disburse the proceeds to Hanaeleh and Bethany's Gait (who are also 501(c)3 Charity Organizations).

Q: What can I tell businesses (or individuals) about the recognition that they will receive for their donation?

A: All who donate will be recognized at the event, on our web site, and a very nice frame-able certificate will be mailed to them.

Q: Where do I take the donated Auction Items? ... When do I need to have them there?

Rick and Karen's. We can receive stuff anytime in the next month ... (just email or call to let us know your coming) ... It would be nice to have all donations at our home a week prior to the event ... (But we'll be happy to receive any items right up to the night before).
